Description

Philadelphia Eagles is an American club of the National Football League that in 2003 started the program “Go Green” in order to be more environmentally responsible. In particular, among others, they focused on an intensive recycling program.

In fact, the team uses a bio-digester that decomposes pre-consumer food waste and that can handle up to 330 pounds daily. Related to it, both fans and employees play an active role as they are encouraged to use proper containers (during each match event).

Environmental benefits

Since its installation, the bio-digester decomposed over 7.4 tons of food waste.

Economic benefits

The practice adopted by Philadelphia Eagles allowed to reduce the costs associated with the collection and disposal of waste.

Applicability and replicability potential

The practice can be potentially applied even in other contexts. However, it is important to consider the investment needed to carry out such an important practice.
